Endowment Fund Established for Yellowknife Seniors' Society

Our Past President, Wendy Bisaro, has made a generous donation to the Yellowknife Community Foundation to establish an endowment fund for the YK Seniors' Society. A public announcement of the fund was announced on September 18, opening the fund for additional donations from the public. When a donation is made to our fund through the Foundation, it is added to a large pool of money, currently about 8.5 million, and professionally invested. Each year proceeds of the pool are distributed as grants.

Over time, the fund and the annual grant distribution are expected to grow. While it will not replace the need to apply for grants from the City of Yellowknife or for specific projects and equipment, the endowment is expected to provide a more stable and reliable source of income that grows over time.

We also received a grant for \$8000 from the Foundation's Community Enrichment Fund to support our *Lunch With A Bunch* Program. A big thank you goes out to the Foundation for your support.
